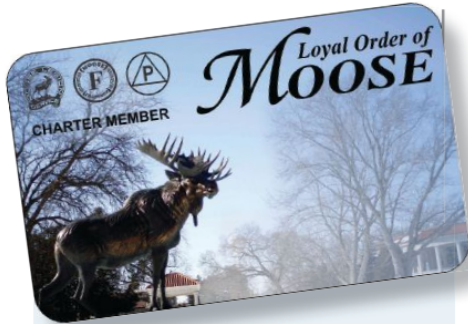

Why Do We Ask You To Show Your Membership Card?



Showing your Moose membership card means:

- The holder is a fraternalist, a friendly person who enjoys the company of others – and who stands ready to help a fellow human being in need.
- The holder is someone who has a special place in his or her heart for children. Through his or her Moose membership, he is doing something real and tangible to provide hope and a better life for youngsters in need, at Mooseheart Child City and School in Illinois.
- The holder is ensured that – even if he or she (and his or her spouse) reaches retirement age without adequate savings – together they will enjoy a secure, dignified retirement without being a burden to either family or society, through the availability of Moosehaven in Florida.

I have walked into many, many Moose lodges during my years as a member. Every time, I have been proud to reach into my wallet as I entered, to fulfill the requirement of displaying my Moose membership card.

Even though showing a Moose membership card every time a member enters a lodge or makes a purchase says many positive things about a person, I know that this requirement has been a big point of irritation among many Moose. “Fifteen years I’ve been a member here; why in the world should I have to show my card every time I walk in the door?”

Consider this scenario: You walk into your lodge’s Social Quarters on a busy Friday afternoon, the door opened for you by a polite smiling younger man you don’t quite recognize. Inside the lodge, the server, recognizing you – and knowing how much it irritates you – decides not to ask for your card. You request and receive a beer. Then, not wanting to offend the young man who held the door for you who is now standing next to you, the server also draws a beer for him without asking for a card.

Then, at the next month’s lodge meeting, this nightmare: your Administrator’s trembling hand holds an invoice for more than \$90,000 in back federal income taxes, interest, penalties and fees. The invoice has been presented to him that day by that same pleasant young man you stood next to at the bar that Friday afternoon! He was the regional IRS agent — and you had been right there when he witnessed the lodge operating as a public accommodation!

This scenario has actually happened to more than one Moose lodge. Their officers and longtime members didn’t want to be “bothered” with having to show their membership cards and subsequently paid a substantial price.

Let’s put the IRS and the income tax issue aside for a moment. Fraternal lodges such as ours enjoy special rights as a private organization, including the right to choose who will associate with us. This does NOT mean we afford ourselves the right to discriminate on the basis of race, religion, etc. in choosing our members.

However, we lose all the rights that a private organization enjoys, if we don’t conduct ourselves as a private organization! We cannot have it both ways. When a lodge chooses not to check membership cards, and essentially opens itself up to the public (with the exception of approved Community Service activities), that lodge puts itself and the entire Fraternity at risk of losing its right to operate under our own rules, and losing the right to choose our own members.

Showing your card may be a slight inconvenience, but it is worth it to protect our Mooseheart kids and Moosehaven seniors entrusted to our care. ■

Membership in the Moose Legion is the stepping stone to the Honorary Degrees of our Order – the Fellowship Degree of Honor and the Pilgrim Degree of Merit. Being called to receive these Honorary Degrees within the Loyal Order of Moose is *only possible through recognized* achievements in the Lodge and Moose Legion.

Why should I consider joining the Moose Legion?

Membership in the Degree of Service offers you additional opportunities to serve childhood and old age, and opens the door to you and your family for theme parties, sporting events, community service projects and other unique activities available only to members of the Moose Legion. Moose Legion Celebrations are held at various Lodges within the jurisdiction of your Moose Legion, and serve as a means to share ideas and enjoy good times with fellow Moose Legionnaires.

Leadership skills may be developed through the Moose Legion Committee of your Lodge or within the Moose Legion jurisdiction.

The Moose Legion is known as the Degree of Service & Leadership. We're made up of male Moose lodge members that desire to do a bit more for our philanthropic causes of serving Mooseheart and Moosehaven as well as being eager for another avenue to enjoy our fraternal membership while supporting our Moose lodges and The Moose.

Some call us the "Fun Degree". All members of honorary Higher Degrees including the Fellowship Degree of Honor and the Pilgrim Degree of Merit, are Moose lodge members first and then Moose Legionnaires before advancing to these higher honorary Degrees.

A portion of our annual Moose Legion dues are distributed as follows:

- \$2.50 to Moosehaven Operations,
- \$2.50 to the Moosehaven Senior Medical Fund,
- \$1.75 to the operation of Mooseheart's Camp Ross,
- \$3.25 to International Moose Legion Operations.

Additionally, each Moose Legion jurisdiction donates to our annual International Moose Legion projects to include a minimum of \$.65 per capita for Youth Awareness scholarships plus financial support for our annual Moose Legion International capital project. For this Moose fiscal year of 2024-2025, we're continuing our pledged renovation and modernization program of the Moose Museum of History (Phase III), on the Mooseheart campus, at \$2.50 per capita less all awarded discounts and early payment incentives.

Our Moose Legion jurisdictions also provide financial contributions to fund Mooseheart student summer trips to Moosehaven as well as an annual International President's Project. International President Ronny Serio's project during his term of office is to fully fund the purchase of a heavy-duty commercial truck to be of service to the entire Mooseheart campus.

Of course, we also collect monies and raise funds, at every opportunity, to support the Mooseheart Moosehaven Endowment Fund. After all, our Degree of Service & Leadership created this program over a hundred years ago, originally known as the "Penny Fund".

It's easy to see that our Moose Legion membership and dues truly make a difference in our fraternal philanthropic endeavors. Moose Legionnaires can all share in the pride of these accomplishments along with so many, many more significant contributions to so many other fraternal programs through Moose Charities and those to our local Moose lodges.

Moose Legionnaires truly understand our current membership campaign entitled "MOOSE - EMBRACE OUR COMMUNITY". Just look at our Moose Legion record of continual service to our Moose fraternity and through our Moose lodges to our communities, for over 100 years. And be assured that we'll continue these same efforts into the future. MOOSE LEGION PROUD!

Our members dedicate countless volunteer hours each year to over 1,400 Chapters across the United States and Canada as well as their communities. More importantly, the Women of the Moose is one of the largest contributors to the support and maintenance of Mooseheart Child City and School and Moosehaven Retirement care facility. On an annual basis, the Women of the Moose throughout the fraternity donate more than one million dollars to support programs and activities at these two campuses.

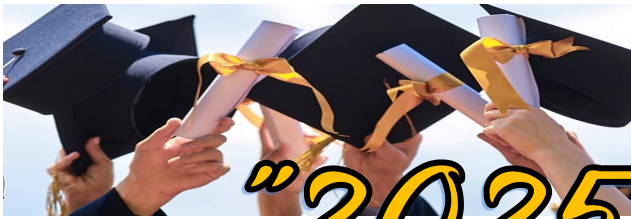

Scholarships Awarded to Terra Nova and Oceana High School Class of 2025 Students

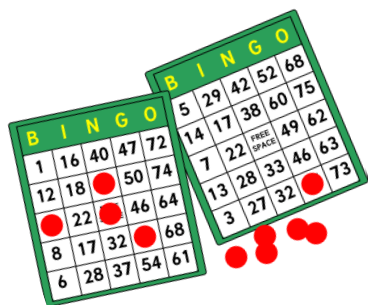

Why Give Blood?

- ♦ Blood is needed every two seconds.
- ♦ About one in seven people entering a hospital needs blood.
- ♦ Blood is always needed for treatment of accident victims, cancer patients, hemophiliacs and surgery patients.
- ♦ Blood cannot be manufactured or harvested.
- ♦ Only 37 percent of our country's population is eligible to give blood, and less than 10 percent donate annually.
- ♦ What if everyone eligible to donate became complacent and decided they didn't need to donate because someone else would?
- ♦ What if there wasn't enough donated blood available when you, a loved one - anyone - needed it?
